



NRSWA Operatives Training

Introduction

This course will enable Operatives to gain the necessary qualifications (Up to 5 groups can be gained) under the New roads and Streetworks Act 1991 to allow them to carry out their duties on the public highway, ranging from excavation to permanent re-instatement of paved structures.

What does the course include?

Candidates will participate in theory lessons and practical demonstrations / exercises all, of which are highlighted by the use of OHP & Videos covering:

- New Roads and Streetworks Act 1991
- Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations
- Other current relevant regulations
- Interpretation of plans
- Safe working practices
- Identification of apparatus
- Excavation techniques
- Disposal of surplus material
- Repositioning of kerbs and edgings
- Use of cable location equipment
- Reinstatement of the road structure
- Reinstatement of modular footpaths
- Use of temporary traffic lights
- Implication of damage to apparatus
- Layout of signs, cones and barriers
- Surface finishing
- Re-use of selected excavated material

How long is the course?

1 – 5 Days

Why do I need it?

The Objectives of the Course are to enable delegates to:

- Gain skills and knowledge to fulfill duties required by the Roads and Streets Works Act 1991.
- Have an understanding of responsibilities under Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 & other current relevant legislation.

What Qualification do I get?

SQA Certification and a Street Works Register ID Card which proves registration on the New Roads & Street Works Qualification Register.

What can I do next?

Once you have completed the operative training course it is possible to progress to the NRSWA Supervisors course.

Where can I train?

The training can be delivered on your site if it meets the course requirements or at one of our three training centres situated throughout the UK.
